

Dukeries - Cuckney walk 2

Park by the church

Leisurely walking

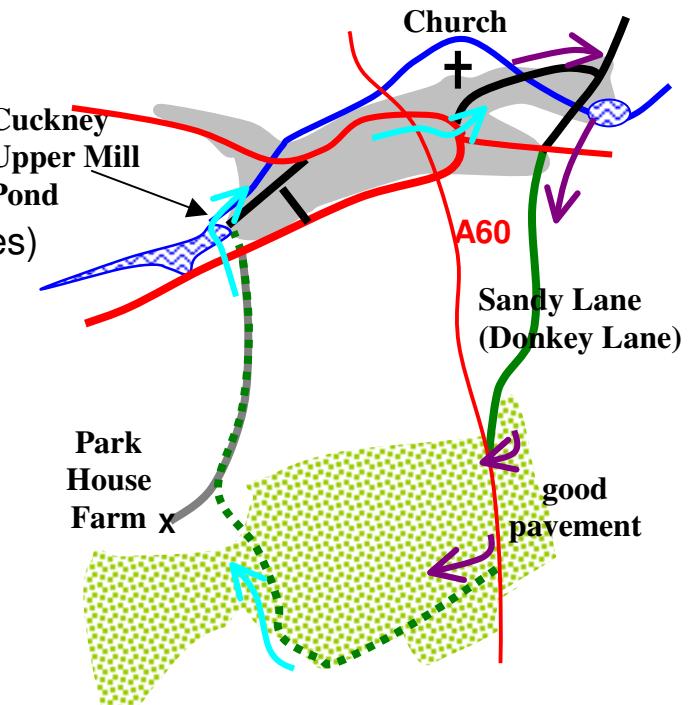
except for Dam Hill(steps both sides) and for a scramble up a 4ft grass bank (40 degrees)

Distance 3miles (4.8 km)

1. Start is by the church go east towards the river following the road to Norton.
2. Take the first right onto Old Mill Lane, cross the A616 and go up Sandy Lane(byway)
3. At the top keep straight on until you come to the A60 at a small vehicle pull in.
Note - there are paths going off to the left into the wood that lead to a wire fence and the footpath that comes out at the top of the Cuckney Hill. These are not recognised Rights of Way.
4. Walk to the top of the vehicle pull in which will bring you level with a lower part of the embankment opposite. You need to be careful crossing and walking up the slope, which is about 4 ft high at this point.
5. Follow the pavement up to the crest of the hill (lay-by) and turn right down the track. This lay-by is an alternative starting point. Follow the track west through the wood. About half way along this straight section the left-hand side opens up.
6. Follow the edge of the wood, which then turns right.
7. At the next corner of the wood bear slightly right and keep straight on into the wood(downhill) – it is the narrower worn path.
8. The path comes out in the corner of a field at Park House Farm. Follow the right-hand side of the field to the field gate.
9. Follow the lane (the cricket club should be on your right).
10. Cross the road to Nether Langwith and climb Mill Hill (steps up and down).
11. Going down the hill keep to the left of the fence until you reach the bottom where you come out on the Dam wall.
12. Take School Lane and Cresswell Road back through the village.
13. Cross the A60 and keep straight on.
14. Turn left at the Greendale Oak. The church should be in front of you.
